End-User Terms and Conditions for use of OxVPS

You are about to access the Oxford Visual Perception Screen ("OxVPS") Clinician Portal (the "Portal") designed to enable Clinicians to utilise OxVPS. OxVPS is a screening tool designed by researchers at the University of Durham and the University of Oxford with the aim of attempting to assist in identifying matters requiring further investigation and/or referrals in relation to individuals who suffer from visual perception problems.

The content made available via the Portal is maintained and provided to you by the University of Durham ("us", "we", or "the University") whose registered address is the Palatine Centre, Stockton Road, Durham, DH1 3LE, United Kingdom.

By proceeding with registration for use of OxVPS and/or gaining access to the Portal and/or OxVPS, including accessing or utilising any of the services or content therein you hereby agree to be legally bound by the following terms and conditions (the "Terms"). If you do not wish to accept and agree to be bound by these Terms, please do not use or access the Portal and/or OxVPS. Doing so implies your express acceptance of the Terms. Your use of the Portal and/or OxVPS is at all times governed by the Terms as set out below, which should be read in conjunction with:

- A. any details provided within the pages relating to the Portal in regards to its operation; and
- B. any terms relating specifically to the content available via the Portal as detailed therein.

1) General

- a) We reserve the right to update or amend these Terms at any time, and therefore in continuing use of the Portal and/or OxVPS and any content or service therein following any such change, you shall be deemed to be granting your acceptance of such change. It is therefore your responsibility at all times to check the Terms regularly to ensure you are aware of any such change. We reserve the right at all times to terminate your access to any or all of the services provided on the Portal at any time, without notice, for any reason, including without limitation, breach of these Terms.
